General Information

- All abstracts must be submitted via the Graphene Week abstract submission website.
- Acknowledgement of receipt of the submission will be sent to the corresponding author within 24 hours.
- The corresponding author will receive all information concerning the abstract and is responsible for informing the presenting author and the co-authors of the status of the abstract.
- The corresponding author will have access to the abstract after submission via an on-line personal page.
- Notification of acceptance will be sent to the stated e-mail address. Please add gw@graphene-flagship.eu to your address book to ensure you do not miss this and other important Graphene Week messages.
- Please note that the abstract must be written in English. It is the author's responsibility to submit a correct abstract; any errors in spelling, grammar, or scientific fact will be reproduced as typed by the author.
- A summary version of the abstract (50 words) is required. The 50 words summary, which will appear in the conference online programme, should

be an explicit summary of the full abstract that states the problem, the methods used, as well as the major results and conclusions. It should be complementary to the title, not a repetition.

- A PDF file of the full abstract must be attached to the submission (minimum 200 words). This file will be used to produce the Graphene Week Programme online. Applications without a PDF attachment will be rejected.
- Please, use the [Microsoft Word template](#) to create the PDF document.
- Any references/citations that are part of the article are included, in full, below the abstract text.
- Abstracts should not include libellous or defamatory content.

Best Poster Award

Selections will be made during poster sessions by the Poster Award Committee based on the level of the research, novelty of findings, quality of the poster, and clarity of the presentation. The winners of the Best Poster Award will receive a certificate issued by the Programme Committee and a prize.

Further submission details

By submitting an abstract, you have agreed to the terms and conditions set out below:

1. **Multiple abstracts:** Only one abstract for each presenting author.
2. **Withdrawing an Abstract:** If a speaker accepts to present, but needs to cancel, the speaker must ASAP contact the gw@graphene-flagship.eu and withdraw the abstract from this dedicated programme position.
3. **Deadline:** The final deadline to submit abstracts is **10 May 2022**, 23:59 Central European Summer Time.
4. **Presentation:** At the Graphene Week (GW), an invited paper is *usually* given 12+3 minutes for presentation + questions. However, presentation lengths vary.
5. **Abstract Review:** All submitted abstract will go through a peer-review process carried out by an international committee.
6. **Abstract Selection:** The GW International Scientific Programme Committee makes the final selection of abstracts to be included. Abstracts can be selected for oral presentations or to be presented as posters. A small number of highest scoring posters are selected for presentation in oral poster discussion sessions, whereas the majority of posters will solely be displayed in the Poster Exhibition.
7. **Notification of Acceptance or Rejection to Corresponding Author:** Notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent to the corresponding author in **June/July 2023**. Authors whose abstracts have been accepted will receive further instructions.

8. **Publication of Accepted Abstracts:** The submission of the abstract constitutes the authors' consent to publication. If the abstract is accepted, the authors agree that their abstract is published in the Graphene Week Digital Programme.
9. **Posters:** Authors should make sure that both title and content correspond to the accepted abstract.
 - a. The poster board can take an A0 poster in 'Portrait' layout (841 x 1189 mm), unless otherwise indicated by the program organizers.
 - b. When designing your poster, remember that attendees may be viewing it from a distance.
 - c. No audio-visual equipment is allowed in poster sessions, unless otherwise indicated by the program organizers.
 - d. Stay with your poster during author attendance times.
10. **Copyright Notice:** Material presented in abstracts should not violate any copyright laws. If figures/graphics/images have been taken from sources not copyrighted by the author, it is the author's sole responsibility to secure the rights from the copyright holder in writing to reproduce those figures/graphics/images for both worldwide print and web publication. All reproduction costs charged by the copyright holder must be borne by the author. Authors who submit to this conference retain copyright over their work, while allowing the conference to place this unpublished work under the care of a PCO service provider.
